

## UPCOMING FREE COURSES OFFERED AT CORE THE LEARNING CENTER

#### **OSHA 10 ONLINE CERTIFICATION**

This OSHA Training for General Industry provides training for entry level workers and provides Prevention of safety and health hazards in the workplace. This is at no cost to students, pre and post testing is required to be eligible for no cost. This is a four-week course, Tuesdays 9am-12noon.

#### Serve Safe (Restaurant) Certification

SERV Safe certification is a food safety training program. The program is developed by the National Restaurant Association and offers multiple certification levels, including: SERV Safe Food Handler SERV Safe Manager. Pre and post testing is required to be eligible for no cost. This is a 4-week course. Tuesdays 1-3pm.

#### GED Prep Classes

A GED Prep class is an educational course designed to prepare individuals for the General Educational Development (GED) test, covering the four main subject areas: Reasoning Through Language Arts (reading and writing), Mathematical Reasoning (basic math and algebra), Science, and Social Studies, with the goal of equipping students with the necessary skills to pass the GED and earn a high school equivalency diploma. Pre-andpost testing is required. Classes run Mon-Fri.

#### NORTHSTAR Digital Literacy Course

An eight-week online interactive computer course that covers basic concepts of computing and teaches students how it can be incorporated into your everyday life and work.

# YOUTH PROGRAMS

### BELFAST >>> AFTERSCHOOL PROGRAM

We had a Cyber Security assembly back in September. -Our younger students learned about being safe on the internet, and safe with their online games. -Our highschoolers learned about how our digital activity is public and permanent, and how to use our social media for good. They also learned about cyber cruelty and how it can affect us. -Save a Life tour came in for grades 9-12. They had their impaired driving simulators, and we also had Ardent Solutions and ACASA bring in different impaired goggles for students to try different tasks while "impaired.".

4th+5th/6th grade Girls and Boys groups have been learning about healthy vs. unhealthy friendships, bullying, and how to be kind.

Some of our 4th grade students have been learning about resiliency in our Why Try group that meets once a week. We have learned about making our own choices and not leaving things to chance, and we learned about consequences that can happen if we make bad choices.

Our high school students have the opportunity to join the Q+A Club we started up. Q+A is a club for LGBTQIA+ Youth and their Allies to express themselves while exploring various themes centered on diversity and inclusion.


